Sight Word Tic-Tac-Toe

The activities below are designed to provide hands-on practice with the sight words that your child learned in kindergarten. Use them with words that your child struggles with in order to have the most impact. Please note that some squares contain a *challenge* that is designed to provide a more difficult task for children who already know their sight words. These *challenge* activities are *optional*, not required.

1. Choose a minimum of 3 activities to complete. Mark them with an "x."
2. You must make "tic-tac-toe, 3 in a row."

<p>Sugar Writing: Pour 1 cup of sugar (or salt) in a flat pan. Use your finger to write a word in the pan. Say each letters name aloud as you spell the word. Gently shake the pan to erase the word and try another one.</p>	<p>** Ransom Note: Use large letters cut from magazines or newspapers. Use them to spell 5 words. Glue them to a piece of paper. <i>Challenge:</i> Write a sentence for each word with pencil. Glue the letters over that word in the sentence.</p>	<p>3 Cheers for Words: Practice spelling words cheerleader style. For example, give me a t. T! Give me a h. H! Give me an e. E! What does that spell? the!</p>
<p>Rainbow Words: Use markers, crayons or colored pencils. Choose 5 to 10 words. Write each word 3 times using a different color each time in order to create rainbow words.</p>	<p>**I Spy!: Choose a book to read. Write the title on a sheet of paper. As you are reading, parent says, "Can you spy <i>and</i>?" Child points out <i>and</i>, then copies it onto the sheet of paper. This works best with a book your child has already read.</p>	<p>**Word Scavenger Hunt: Fold a sheet of paper to make 6 boxes. Write one word in each box. Look for your words in magazines, newspapers, or other printed text. Cut the words out and glue them in the appropriate box. <i>Challenge:</i> How many times can you find each word?</p>
<p>Online Game: Go to http://www.starfall.com/n/matching/sight-words/load.htm to play a sight word matching game. Play at least 3 levels.</p>	<p>**Type it! Choose 10 words. Type them in lowercase letters. You may use fun fonts. Print your work. <i>Challenge:</i> Sort your list in some way. Ideas might be length, ABC order, or parts of speech.</p>	<p>Clay Letters: Use modeling clay or play dough. Roll it into long "snakes." Use the snakes to make the letters in a word. Once you spell it say each letter name aloud and then read the whole word. Then try another word.</p>
